2010 Abbey Outing to Bedfordshire



On one of the hottest days of the year, 10th July, the Abbey band plus intrepid guests ventured forth on our ringing outing to south Bedfordshire. We rang at five towers, all of them with 8 bells, the first and last having strong connections with Katherine of Aragon, King Henry VIII's first wife (explanation later). We started at St Andrews, Ampthill (13 cwt) where we were greeted by our host arriving on a bicycle with a replacement stay for the 2nd

bell, which he fitted before we started ringing! The bells handled very well, with a lovely musical sound, though a few sensitive souls thought the bells were a bit too loud in the ringing chamber itself. Then on to St Georges, Toddington (21 cwt) with just enough time to have a quick look around the Community Market on the village green, where some honey was bought. The ringing chamber was embellished with arches and columns and although the bells were harder work, we managed to ring Cambridge and Lincolnshire. Next stop was St Marys, Woburn (24 cwt), a Gothic Revival church with amazing gargoyles and a fine interior, although there was an ominous-looking crack running up the staircase wall. These bells were the heaviest of the day but handled beautifully. We then had a leisurely lunch at the Black Horse in Woburn.

After lunch we rang at St James, Husborne Crawley (18 cwt), notable for the bright green stone used on the exterior of the tower, quarried from the local Greensand Ridge. The lofty ringing chamber, with a good view of the interior of the church, was accessed by a spiral staircase using old sallies as a handrail. We saved the best till last. The bells of the Priory Church of St Peter, Dunstable (23 cwt) were a delight to ring and listen to. Not only that, but the ringing chamber was blissfully cool and airy, although the access was via two ladders inside what appeared to be a cupboard!

In summary, we had a very enjoyable day, and experienced some fine towers. The ringing ranged from call changes to 8-spliced to accommodate all levels of ability. Some of us finished off the day with drinks and a meal at The Chequers, Redbourn.

And the connection with Katherine of Aragon? She lived at Ampthill Castle during the divorce proceedings with Henry VIII (and there's a memorial window in the church), and it was in the Lady Chapel (no longer in existence) at Dunstable Priory that the court investigating the validity of the marriage was held, and where the annulment of the marriage was decided.

Help keep the bells ringing

Mark Regan, Master of Worcester Cathedral and renowned coach and ringer, kindly offered to give an inspiring talk in the Crypt at St Albans Cathedral on 'Tips and Tricks to Re-energise County Ringing'.

The event was part of a larger planned recruitment drive for Abbey Ringers, to increase interest and involvement in ringing, and to share our vision with Hertfordshire ringing at large.

Mark has led his band from what might be described as a typical standard for a county Cathedral with a heavy 12 to what is now a vibrant, strong band with a healthy source of new recruits supported by a ring of 8 high-tech dumb-bells.

He was happy to share what has worked and what has not worked during this initiative, to spur thinking and ideas and make practical suggestions for ways that would make a difference to our bands.

The objectives of the event were for people attending to come away with:

1. Practical suggestions for building an integrated community for ringing
2. Clarity on potential key opportunities available in Hertfordshire
3. Having enjoyed finding out about a success story and sharing ideas with local friends and colleagues.
